

Manitoba sales continued to climb in June, up 5.6% year-over-year, and continued to outpace the first half of 2023. Average home prices continued to trend up, with a 5.7% increase in average prices compared to last June. Months of inventory remained flat at 2.6.

Winnipeg had similar yearly improvements with a 5.1% increase in sales and a 5.5% increase in the sales price. The sales-to-new listings ratio for Winnipeg was 69% which was 3 points higher than last year and 3 points lower than the previous month; current levels indicate the market is still favouring the sellers.

The unemployment rate increased 0.2 points to 5.1%. The largest sectoral monthly declines occurred in Information, Culture and Recreation (-2,900); Manufacturing (-2,800); and Public Administration (-700). The largest sectoral monthly improvements were in Agriculture (+2,700); Trade (+2,200); and Health Care and Social Assistance (+1,700). The overall monthly full-time employment increased by 4,400 jobs while the monthly part-time employment decreased by 1,200 jobs.


