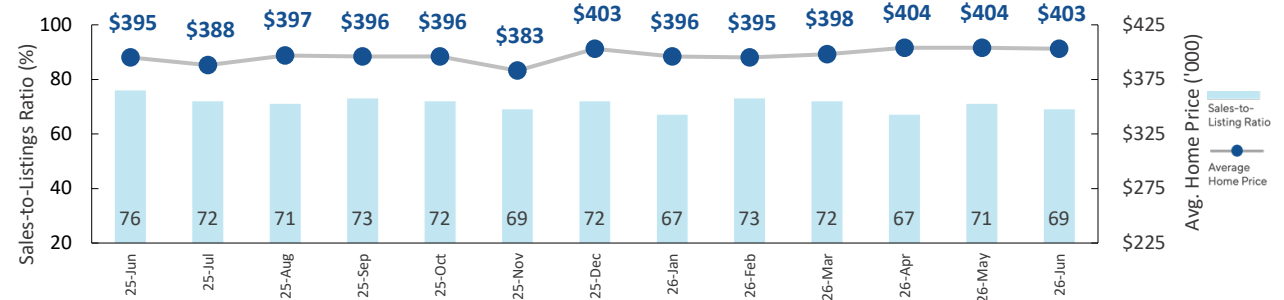

Manitoba's sales decreased 2.6% yearly, but the province remains in a sellers' market and the average price continued upward to \$403,365 (+2.1% yearly). Midway through 2026, Manitoba sales are lower than 2025 by about 7%. Months of inventory increased slightly to 2.3 months.

Winnipeg sales decreased yearly by 2.3% while the average price increased to \$425,093 (+2.4% yearly). Winnipeg remains in a sellers' market with a 68% sales-to-new listings ratio.

The unemployment rate decreased 0.1 pts to 5.4%. The largest monthly industry employment declines occurred in Transportation and Warehousing (-1,800), Information, Culture & Recreation (-1,400), Educational Services (-1,400). The largest sector increases for the month were in Accommodation and Food Services (+2,500), Other Services (+1,700), and Manufacturing (+1,600). Monthly full-time employment increased by 2,900 jobs, and the monthly part-time employment decreased by 2,900 jobs. Overall, employment increased by 100 jobs for the month.
